Lolita's Story

LOLITA BEING TAKEN FROM HER FAMILY



Lolita was captured off the coast of Washington state in 1970 and sold to the Miami Seaquarium for \$6,000. She was just 6-years-old when taken from her mother. She has been held in captivity for 33 years in the oldest and smallest orca tank in the world, a tank that does not even meet minimum government size requirements. Yet no one is enforcing the law. This tiny, chlorinated cement tank has been her only home for 33 years.

She's earned her retirement.

Twice daily Lolita is forced to perform tricks for food in front of mesmerized crowds. She's earned the Seaquarium over two-hundred-million-dollars thus far. The Miami Seaquarium has been promising to build Lolita a larger tank since 1978. They've been lying to the public for 25 years. **It's time.**

Dolphins and whales *can* be retired. It's done all the time. Keiko (the "Free Willy" whale) is enjoying his new freedom after decades in confinement. **Lolita's next.**

Marine biologists insist Lolita could be the future of her diminishing pod. The plan is intact and has been proven effective. The people, politicians, and marine experts of Washington State want Lolita returned to a natural sea-pen in Puget Sound where she can retire in peace.

The Miami Seaquarium is a for-profit wildlife exploitation company.

FACTS:

The Seaquarium captured and sold hundreds of dolphins into a life of slavery.

150 orcas have died in captivity since 1968 and 974 Dolphins.

Orcas in the wild can live up to 90 years.

In captivity they rarely make it to their teens.

Lolita's tank is illegal by USDA standards under the Animal Welfare Act. Humane Society of the United States filed formal complaints against MSQ

Lolita has not seen another orca in 23 years.

Seaquarium Killed Hugo and 'Flipper' by working them to death.

Seaquarium spent money on a new cafeteria rather than a new tank.

A tank is akin to a house-of-mirrors to an acoustical creature.

Marine mammals perform for food because they are conditioned and hungry.

Specialists all say Lolita is a perfect candidate for retirement and rehabilitation.

Lolita *will* die in this tank if we don't act responsibly.
